IF you are thinking about calling us to administer IV sedation to your patients here are a few questions we have commonly run across:

Question: Will my patient be asleep during the entire procedure?

Answer: Yes, they will be sedated enough to the point where they are completely unconscious. There are times where patients under deep sedation might open their eyes, perhaps move an arm, but they rarely, if ever recall such an event. It would be highly unusual to experience any pain of any sort during the procedure. If there is an indication of pain, we would advance your patient into the state of general anesthesia, but we avoid this if we are able.

Question: What are some of the side effects?

Answer: Individual reactions to the anesthetic may vary, but statistically speaking we are concerned only with nausea or, rarely a sore throat. In the unlikely event that your patient does have nausea afterwards, there are excellent medications to deal with this problem.

Question: Will you be there the entire time my patient is asleep.

Answer: Yes, a board-certified anesthesiologist will be there from the moment your patient goes to sleep until the time they are fully awake and responding to questions. A certified nurse also accompanies the anesthesiologist on every case. This nurse will monitor recovery as well.

Question: Do I need to receive any training to have your service in my office?

Answer: In conjunction with the Missouri Dental Board, we have created a Sedation Monitoring Class for you and your staff to attend. You will only need to attend once. The Dental Board will then visit your office to site certify your office which plainly states that your facility is a safe site to administer deep sedation / general anesthesia. There is never a charge for these services.
